WOODSIDE TO CONTRIBUTE A\$1 MILLION TO EXMOUTH RECOVERY FOLLOWING TROPICAL CYCLONE NARELLE

Woodside Energy will contribute A\$1,000,000 to support relief and recovery efforts following the severe impacts of Tropical Cyclone Narelle on the Exmouth community in Western Australia's Gascoyne Region.

Tropical Cyclone Narelle made landfall near Exmouth in late March 2026, resulting in extensive damage to hundreds of homes and businesses, as well as disruptions to essential services including power and water.

The funding will support community-led recovery activities in Exmouth. The Shire of Exmouth is working with the community to determine recovery priorities addressing social, environmental, infrastructure, and economic needs.
