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## INTRODUCTION

Woodside Energy Ltd (Woodside) are proposing to develop a Woodside Solar Facility, approximately 15 kilometres (km) southwest of Karratha, Western Australia (WA) once Woodside has secured all necessary transmission arrangements and associated commercial arrangements and regulatory approvals to proceed with a Final Investment Decision (FID) in respect to this project. This will generate electricity from a large scale solar photovoltaic farm (Solar PV Farm), complemented by energy storage (Battery Storage) infrastructure (the Proposal). The Proposal will supply renewable energy for use by industrial customers on the Burrup Peninsula.

On the 20 December 2023, Woodside received Commonwealth approval to develop the Proposal under EPBC Approval 2022/09328.

This Annual Compliance Report has been prepared in accordance with Conditions 30, 31 and 32 of EPBC Approval 2022/09328 as follows:

*Condition 30: The approval holder must prepare a compliance report for each 12-month period following the date of this approval decision, or as otherwise agreed to in writing by the Minister.*

*Condition 31: Each compliance report must be consistent with the Annual Compliance Report Guidelines, Commonwealth of Australia 2023.*
