North West Shelf Project Extension



For more than 40 years, the North West Shelf Project has been supplying affordable and reliable natural gas to Western Australian customers, contributing royalties and tax, providing jobs and investing in regional development. Since 1989, the project has exported Liquefied Natural Gas to international customers.

Located in north-western Australia, the North West Shelf Project is a nationally significant asset. The project includes a network of offshore oil and gas infrastructure and an onshore processing facility in Karratha, Western Australia.

The term "North West Shelf Project Extension" relates to environmental approval for ongoing operations for Karratha Gas Plant beyond 2030. It is not an expansion.

After six years of assessment and appeals State Government approval for North West Shelf Project Extension was received in December 2024.

The Federal Government provided proposed environmental approval in May 2025 with a number of conditions which relate to matters including cultural heritage management and air quality. Woodside recognises the significance of these matters and are reviewing the proposed conditions to understand their application.

By using existing infrastructure, the project can continue to support local and global energy security and regional development opportunities.

The North West Shelf Project is a major employer in Western Australia with almost 900 direct employees and 1300 contractors supporting our operations.

The project also engages more than 700 Western Australian businesses and supports thousands of indirect jobs in the industries that rely on North West Shelf gas.

More than 280 Karratha employees and their families reside in the City of Karratha.



The North West Shelf Project plays a critical role in supporting energy security, both in Western Australia and for our international customers.

Over 40 years, the project has supplied more than 6000 petajoules of domestic gas to Western Australia, powering homes and industry. If used for just household electricity this is enough to power homes in cities like Perth for approximately 175 years.

In 2024, the project supplied 14% of Western Australia's total domestic gas supply. To date, the project has delivered more than 6000 LNG cargoes overseas.

Community 8

The North West Shelf Project has invested well over \$300 million in community contributions in the City of Karratha.

Our support can be seen throughout the community, including the Red Earth Arts Precinct, the Leisureplex. local schools and childcare centres and healthcare infrastructure.

For more than 15 years, the project has supported education outcomes through the Pilbara Education Initiative.



The North West Shelf Project pays its fair share of taxes.

Over the past four decades, the project has paid more than \$40 billion in federal royalties and excise.

In 2024/25, the North West Shelf Project is expected to deliver \$614 million in royalties to Western Australia with royalties also delivered to the Federal Government.
