


Scarborough Energy Project

2024 Community Development





The Scarborough Energy Project is targeting first LNG cargo in the second half of 2026, and includes the development of:

- New offshore facilities at the Scarborough gas field, located approximately 375 km off the coast of Karratha, Western Australia
- An approximately 430 km pipeline connecting the offshore facilities to onshore processing infrastructure
- A second Liquified Natural Gas (LNG) train Pluto Train 2 at the existing Pluto LNG Plant onshore, including installation of additional domestic gas processing facilities and supporting infrastructure
- Modifications to the existing Pluto Train 1 facility and associated infrastructure to enable gas from the Scarborough field to be processed
- The Integrated Remote Operations Centre (IROC), allowing both the Scarborough and Pluto assets to be remotely operated from Woodside's headquarters in Perth.

The Scarborough Energy Project (the Project) was approved in November 2021 and since then, it has contributed significantly to local communities in Karratha, Roebourne and Exmouth through new jobs, business opportunities and contributions to community.

Construction of the new onshore LNG train and related inlet facilities is being executed by the Engineering, Procurement, and Construction (EPC) contractor, Bechtel. The first modules for Pluto Train 2 arrived in February 2024 and by the end of December 2024, all 51 modules were set in place on site.

Bechtel and Woodside have continued to engage with Karratha and Roebourne community groups, Traditional Custodians and local businesses to implement opportunities around the Project.



The Scarborough Joint Venture comprises Woodside (Operator) 74.9%, JERA 15.1% and LNG Japan 10%.

The Pluto Train 2 Joint Venture comprises, Woodside (Operator) 51% and Global Infrastructure Partners 49%.

The Pluto Joint Venture comprises Woodside (Operator) 90%, Kansai Electric 5% and MidOcean Energy 5%.

Woodside Energy recognises Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples as Australia's First People's.

2024 Highlights

Economic Contribution

The Scarborough Energy Project is estimated to spend over **A\$5.4 billion** in WA throughout the development phase of the project.



Over **A\$190 million** in contracts awarded by Woodside or our contractors to Karratha-based businesses*

In 2024, Woodside and project participants contributed over **A\$6 million** to the Western Australian Construction Training Fund, helping to train the next generation of workers in the building and construction industry.



Employment

A total of **1,622 employees** from Bechtel and their subcontractors are from WA.

Skills Development and Training



Woodside and Bechtel worked with the Ngarliyarndu Bindirri Aboriginal Corporation to deliver a 'work-ready' program.

Regional Development

A total of **110 businesses** in Karratha and a further **360 businesses** in the rest of WA have been engaged by Woodside or our contractors.*

Together with contractors, awarded **52 contracts** to Indigenous businesses with a value of over **A\$104 million** across Australia.*

Community Investment

A new Student Support Hub at Exmouth District High School provides services to **526 students** including 63 Aboriginal and Torres Straits Islander students via dedicated Aboriginal and Islander Education Officers.

Woodside's Community Grants program supported **42 community organisations** in Karratha and Exmouth.

Woodside and the Project participants continued a five-year community development partnership with the City of Karratha in 2024 with the Scarborough Energy Project contributing **A\$704,000.**

A Massive Undertaking

Since February 2024, a total of 51 modules, weighing a combined 56,000 tonnes, have been shipped to Karratha from the module yard in Batam, Indonesia, where they were built. Expanding the Pluto LNG facility to include a second LNG processing train provides an efficient way to process gas from the offshore Scarborough field.
