Meeting opened at 1pm.

Woodside provided an Acknowledgement of Country and welcomed new members to the Karratha Community Liaison Group (CLG).

## Meeting expectations

## Operations Update (refer to slides 9-10-11)

Woodside provided an Operations update, including on:

- North West Shelf Project Extension
- World Heritage and Murujuga Rock Art Management Plan (MRAMP)
- Planned Maintenance
- Apprenticeships and Traineeships.

## Summary of discussion

- Woodside is engaged in ongoing consultation with the Federal Government about the proposed conditions for the North West Shelf Project Extension's environmental approval. The consultation period has been extended, with all parties aiming to complete the process as soon as possible.

**Project Update (refer to slide 13)**

Woodside provided a Pluto Train 2 update, including an overview of pipeline blowing activities.

**Decommissioning update (refer to slides 15-16-17)**

Woodside provided a Decommissioning update, including:

- Current offshore decommissioning campaigns
- Onshore disposal
- Recycling targets.

**Summary of discussion**

- Large infrastructure over 100 metres can be transported to Henderson by barge or by cutting it into pieces for heavy lift vessels.
- Dismantling and contaminant testing are handled by contractors, using facilities capable of removing Naturally Occurring Radioactive Material (NORMs).
- Some contaminated material is sent to Australia's sole Class 5 waste facility, whereas previously such material was exported.
- There is potential for increased involvement of local Australian contractors, with established principal contractors in Karratha or the region hiring local sub-contractors.
- Woodside is considering artificial reefs, as illustrated using infrastructure from Griffin at King Reef, and is exploring further reef opportunities.

**Social Economic Impact Assessment (SEIA) (refer to slides 19-20-21-22)**

Woodside provided a SEIA update, including:

- SEIA conducted by GHD
- Summary of themes raised by stakeholders
- Next steps for the SEIA and when the CLG will be engaged.

**Summary of discussion**

Woodside undertakes Social Impact Assessments (SIAs) to improve its understanding of social and economic impacts of its operations and projects and priorities of the local community. The 2022 SIA recommended changes to Community Liaison Group to reflect best practice. This has resulted revising its structure, updating membership, and engaging community-based members.

**Community contribution (refer to slide 24)**

Woodside provided a Community Contribution update, including:

- Contracts awarded for 30 new builds in Karratha
- Renewed partnership with One Tree Community Services.

**Summary of Discussion**

30 new houses are being constructed to own, in contrast to a previous 20 that were long-term leases. Costings for the project are not being disclosed due to commercial confidentiality. The homes will be either 3-bedroom, 2-bathroom or 4-bedroom, 2-bathroom, and include amenities such as sheds with the aim of supporting attraction and retention of Karratha based workforce.

**Environment Plans (EPs) (refer to slides 26-27-28-29-30)**

Woodside provided an EPs update, including:

- New EPs open for consultation

- Upcoming EPs
- EPs the CLG was previously consulted on.
