Woodside provided an Acknowledgement of Country and conducted a round table introduction for those attending.

Values Share

Woodside reflected on Cyclone Narelle and the impacts to the Exmouth and Onslow communities and their ongoing recovery efforts.

Operations Update (refer to slides 7-9)

Woodside provided an Operations update on:

- Planned maintenance activities at both Pluto LNG and Karratha Gas Plant.
- Prioritised use of village accommodation, where possible, during the planned maintenance activities to minimise impact to the community. This includes buses to and from the assets and reinforcing expectations that people working at their facilities engage respectfully at work and in the community.
- Record low flaring levels at Karratha Gas Plant in 2025, with flare quantities less than 10% of their peak in 2013.
- The 23 Karratha-based recruits from Programmed Skilled Workforce who were welcomed to the Training Academy this year, 13 of which were school leavers and two were school based trainees.

Summary of discussion

There was a query whether the upcoming turnaround would be moved this year.

Woodside provided the response – The planned turnaround at Pluto LNG is proceeding as planned.

Projects Update (refer to slides 10-15)

Bechtel provided an update on the Pluto Train 2 project, covering commissioning and start up as well as local content and community participation.

Community contributions (refer to slides 16-18)

Woodside provided an update on a range of community related topics including:

- The opening of the new secondary school facilities at Roebourne District High School. The build is supported by Woodside's \$20 million contribution through the WA Government's Resources Community Investment Initiative (RCII).
- Accommodation planning to ensure that the NWS and Pluto LNG workforces can be accommodated in Karratha.
- The current capacity of Woodside's housing portfolio, which is currently close to capacity at more than 95% occupancy.

Woodside provided an overview of upcoming environmental plans with consultation dates provided on the following activities:

- CK4 and LH3 Well Intervention.
- Goodwyn A Operations.
