We do not fund initiatives that conflict with our Code of Conduct, regulatory obligations, or statutory commitments.

What we don't fund

We do not provide social investment funding for:

- Political donations
- Requests from individuals (e.g. study, medical treatment, accommodation)
- Commercial requests including funding for private or public companies
- Memberships or sponsorships primarily for marketing/branding
- Religious activities
- Indirect fundraising (e.g. events, raffles, advertising)
- Ongoing operational funding that creates dependency
- Travel (except where directly required to deliver an eligible initiative).

Key questions and answers

Where we fund

We focus our investment on the our host communities. This ensures our support is consistent with global outcomes across our People and Place priorities, is locally relevant and responds to community needs.

What is a measurable outcome?

We place strong emphasis on understanding the outcomes your initiative will achieve.

We ask applicants to clearly describe:

- What will be delivered (e.g. workshops, programs, number of participants)
- What will change as a result (e.g. improved skills, knowledge and wellbeing).

What we look for in applications?

When assessing applications, we consider whether initiatives:

- Respond to a genuine local need
- Deliver clear and realistic outcomes
- Create lasting community benefit
- Demonstrate value for money
- Are supported by the community
- Complement, rather than duplicate, existing initiatives.

All of these factors help ensure our funding is proportionate to the reach and measurable outcomes of the initiative.

We'll also ask you to provide information about your organisation so we can clearly understand who you are and how you operate.

What happens if your application is successful?

If your application is successful, we'll put an agreement in place to confirm the funding, expected outcomes and how you'll keep us updated.

We'll ask you to:

- Provide an update at agreed points during or after your project
- Share what was delivered and the difference your initiative made
- Submit supporting materials, such as financial evidence, photos and case studies.

Other key considerations

- We provide one community grant per organisation per calendar year
- We do not provide retrospective funding
- Requests to meet may be considered but are not guaranteed.
