

B4SI Assurance Statement 2025

Overview

SLR Consulting, as managers of Business for Societal Impact (B4SI), have been asked by Woodside Energy to review its use of the B4SI Framework for measuring corporate community investment (CCI) programmes between 1 January and 31 December 2025.

The B4SI Frameworks help businesses to improve the management, measurement, and reporting of their social impact. A combination of three Frameworks covers Community Investment, Social Innovation & Procurement for Social Impact. (See <https://b4si.net> for more information).

Woodside Energy has been an active member of the B4SI global network since 2010. SLR Consulting, as global managers of B4SI, have worked with Woodside Energy to provide verification and limited assurance of its community investment data gathered over the period from January to December 2025 and the application of the B4SI Community Investment Framework, in accordance with current Guidance. The scope of assurance covers inputs contributed through the company's Community Investment. Having conducted our assessment nothing has come to our attention which causes us to believe that the reported data, as stated in the Appendix for this document, does not accurately reflect the B4SI principles. Our work has not extended to an independent audit of the data.

In our commentary we identify the main findings of the Assurance process. We have further explained our observations in a separate management report.

Commentary

As part of its efforts to ensure a robust application of the Framework, Woodside Energy has had its CCI data verified and assured by B4SI this year. The assurance engagement was undertaken to a limited level, maintaining detailed records of meetings and correspondence. Contribution amounts were also verified against evidence for at least 80% of contributions made in cash, as defined by B4SI.

Woodside Energy has demonstrated a strong commitment to rigorous measurement and reporting and continuous improvement in collecting its CCI data according to the principles of the B4SI Framework.

The data shows a total voluntary contribution of AUD 36,940,561 between January 2025 and December 2025, of which 74.8% was in cash donations. Of its total voluntary contributions, Woodside Energy contributed 60.6% through strategic community investment and 28.6% through commercial initiatives in the community. When examining contribution focus, 56.7% of Woodside Energy's total contribution was dedicated to Education, followed by Social Welfare at 23.5% and Arts & Culture third at 9.7%. In addition to voluntary investment, Woodside Energy also contributed AUD 7,221,105 to the community, required by government regulations or contractual agreements with Indigenous People.

Woodside Energy measures most of its inputs from all its international operations. The definitions used for each measure are backed by the B4SI Framework and are put in practice in collaboration with internal teams and partners to gather the data. Partnership managers have responsibility for collecting data that the global social performance team then collates and reviews periodically.

The global social performance team is also responsible for continuous training of programme managers to ensure they have access to guidance material which is based on B4SI Guidance. Both contributions and volunteering figures are reviewed internally and overseen by the social performance team.

Our review of Woodside Energy's 2025 Community Investment data revealed an overall comprehension of the B4SI Framework's implementation.
